A brief description from Leslie of using her medium in making her jewelry. It comes in several types of metals: bronze copper sterling silver and fine silver Precious Metal Clay (PMC).

I use the Fine Silver Precious Metal Clay PMC) that is 99.99% pure silver. The silver is first pulverized and together with a binding agent turns into a form of clay. Fine Silver PMC. This medium gives me more latitude in making various types of jewelry and small figurines. Come to see how a lump of clay is transformed into a lovely piece of jewelry and Enjoy.
