Gay Diz is going to lead a KAL, or knit-along, for a pair of felted clogs. The pattern is 'Felt Clogs' designed by Bev Galeskas and can be found on the Fiber Trends webpage or Ravelry. It requires worsted weight 100% wool [NOT super wash] which will be

held double, and size 13 needles. If you don't have these you can check out The Stitchery ahead of time to see what is available there. If you are a beginner knitter there will be plenty of help to get you through any new techniques. For any other questions call Gay at 814 397 -1784 or Marion at 912 270-1282.

For those not interested in making clogs bring along whatever projects you are working on to show and share. Lainie will also be demonstrating a lace pattern called waving wheat. Bring size 7 needles and suitable mid weight yarn to make a practice sample.
