First order of business was to take a few minutes to remember Lois Vogelmann, a long time member of the guild. Several members expressed their warm regards of Lois and what she had meant to both them and the Guild. Lois was a charter member of the Guild. She was a weaver and, most recently, an active member of the Felting Group. Her son has said how much Lois had enjoyed her time with the Guild and asked that we remember her in that context.

The reading of the minutes for the March 06, 2023 meeting had been waived due to problems with it not being published in the newsletter due to computer problems. Both the March 06 and the April 03 minutes were approved as they had appeared in the newsletter.

Business

Cathe McEnerney will continue to work on revising the by-laws that govern the guild. Until the revisions are in place and approved by the membership, Golden Isles Fiberarts Guild will continue to operate as usual.

Jean Sucher made a plea for 17 quilts, XL twin size (68x90) as requested from "Hand in Hand" a group that is aiding the furnishing of the tiny houses built for the homeless in Brunswick.

Treasurer Joyce Poole reported an ending balance of \$2,868.19. This amount does not reflect the membership dues now being collected.

Membership/Newsletter -- Wanda Ruger requested that submissions to the newsletter be made by May 19.

Hospitality Chair Linda Mahoney informed that Bo Anderson of The Stitchery on St. Simons Island would be having surgery but that the shop will remain opened. A remembrance is to be sent.

Photography will be taken over from our very capable Julia Cieszeski by Jeanne Cieszeski and Janie Pritchard. Julia will continue to post on Facebook.

Louise Eaton will begin publicizing the semi-annual show at the SoGlo Gallery which begins the first Friday in February 2024. There will be a need for items to sell as well as display. Our goal is that at least 50% of all items shown will be for sale. This is a collective target goal -- not for each member. Volunteers are needed for the show and especially the fashion show.


